Cage Types



Wire cages have great circulation and air quality, but poor insulation, and require a plastic bottom to avoid injuries



Glass cages have great insulation and protection from drafts, but not much ventilation or air flow, and

condensation is a concern

Cage Habitat



Bedding – burrowing is a favorite pastime, so a quarter inch of bedding is best



Gnawing Pieces –
hamsters need
something to chew
on regularly to keep
their teeth healthy



Food and Water – a tablespoon of dry food daily and access to water at all times are required



Nest Boxes – sleeping 12–14 hours a day, they prefer hidden areas with one box per hamster



Active Pieces – climbing equipment and wheels are great options for regular exercise

If you are considering getting a dwarf hamster, keep in mind that these small, furry creatures require the same amount of love, attention and respect as any other pet that lives in your home.
